Module Aim

This module will aim to build on your foundational skills in practical filmmaking and visual storytelling and introduce you to the key technical and production skills involved in the specialist use of the 16mm camera.

Summary Module Description

The module will focus on advancing students' technical competencies, subject knowledge - deepening them through the discipline that is required when working with the Super 16mm film format and associated workflows. 16mm Pre-Production, Production and Post-Production requires a deep understanding of and greater attention to the workflow and processes, particularly when working with a film negative acquisition.

The module will cover training in the following crew roles to an intermediate level:

- 1. Director
- 2. Producer
- 3. Director of Photography
- 4. Camera Operator
- 5. 1st Assistant Director
- 6. Continuity / Editor
- 7. Sound / Boom Operator
- 8. Sound Recordist /Mixer

9. Production Designer

Additionally, students will be trained in the following camera department roles to facilitate and support shooting with a Super 16mm format:

- 1. Gaffer
- 2. Focus Puller
- 3. Clapper / Loader
- 4. Camera Assistant

Students will explore in greater detail the relationship between cinematography and art direction in defining and creating the look of a film. Sound and editing are also explored in how they are utilized to support the storytelling process.
