Summary Module Description

To introduce those, without any filmmaking knowledge, to the CFS filmmaking equipment through technical induction sessions, workshops and supervised studio practice.

These workshops will familiarise you with basic camera, sound and lighting equipment as well as the application of an editing programme such as Adobe Premiere.

Your understanding of the equipment will be applied to the making of a short film where you will also learn about the basic production management paperwork required when producing a film project.
